## DESCRIPTIVE LIST OF PLATES

On Plates showing the excavations (1-54) the successive periods are indicated by the numerals $1-11$, as explained in Vol. I, p. 93, n. 2. These numerals are often so placed as to indicate at the same time individual objects of the respective periods. On Plates $84-90$ (1908) numerals indicate single objects, without reference to periods. Individual objects are also indicated by letters and other marks on the face of the photograph, as on Plate 3b. On Plates representing the archæological material (Plates $55-83,89,90$ ) several objects are often given on a single photograph. These may be numbered $1,2,3$, etc., or may remain unnumbered. When reference is made in the text to such unnumbered objects it is to be understood that the left-hand object of the top row is ordinarily No. 1; the next to the right, No. 2, and so on. In this List of Plates registration numbers or diseard numbers referring to such unnumbered objects follow the same order. Thus, in List 73a, 2843 is the first object; 2815, the second, etc. In the few cases omitting the registration number or the discard number in the List of Plates, the reader should consult the Index of References to Plates (Vol. I, p. 417). In some instances of objects, either numbered or unnumbered, on Plates $84-90$, this work offers no further account than is contained in the title of the photograph. The explanation is that the photograph, when originally made on the field of excavation, had no reference to future publication. The selection for publication was made on account of the other objects given on the photograph.

Note. The foregoing Index shows the reader where to find on the plans the position of rooms, cisterns, etc., named in the titles of the photographs and in the text. Even where, as occasionally happens, the object is not drawn, or if drawn is not numbered, the reference to letters and numerals on the margin of the plans indicates the square to which it belongs. Cisterns and caves are usually represented on the plans by broken lines. In the case of cisterns the circular or rectangular form of the opening is also ordinarily indicated. The Roman numerals I-IV, given in connection with the first strips excavated (strips 1 and 2), indicate successive strata or periods, reckoning from $I=$ Roman, $I I=$ Herodian, $I I I=$ Preherodian, down to $I V=I$ Israelite. The text and a few of the photographic plates make similar use of these numerals.
